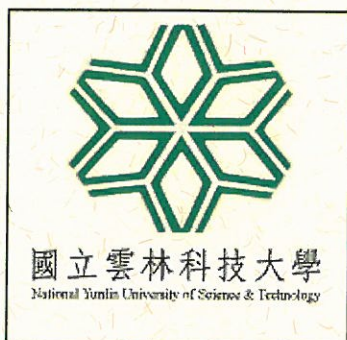


LETTER OF INTENT

This LETTER OF INTENT dated 19 AUGUST 2004 is between:

PREAMBLE

The University of Canberra (ABN 81 633 873 422) a body corporate established by the *University of Canberra Act 1989* of the Australian Capital Territory having its office at University Drive, Bruce, ACT 2601

and

the National Yunlin University of Science and Technology, having its office at 123 University Road, Section 3. Touliu, Yunlin, Taiwan, 640

agree to formally establish a collaborative relationship under the principles of equality and mutual benefit.

The agreement is as follows:

1. TERM

This Letter of Intent will commence on its signed date and shall remain in force for a period of twenty four (24) months unless terminated earlier in accordance with Clause 4, or when an Agreement is reached and signed to supersede the purpose of this Letter of Intent.

2. PURPOSE

2.1 Joint research activities

Both parties shall actively cooperate to encourage and participate in joint research and activities, such as mutual visits, research projects, collaborative workshops, distance teaching activities and so forth with the purpose of promoting education quality and academic achievements. In order to enhance the cooperation, the research topics and outcomes shall be examined and reviewed annually by both sides.

2.2 Faculty exchange program

Both parties agree to work to facilitate opportunities for faculty exchange. The details of such a program would need to be discussed so that the process accords with the policies of each institution.

3. VARIATION

This Letter of Intent may be extended with the agreement of the parties. The terms and conditions for any such extension shall be agreed in writing and signed by the two parties.

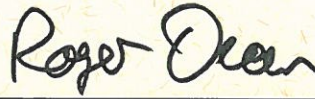
4. TERMINATION

This Letter of Intent shall cease at any time up to twenty four (24) months after the signing of the Letter provided one of the parties gives written notice to the other of its intention to terminate the discussions referred to above. In the event of termination under this Clause, neither party can claim from the other in respect of expenditure or obligations incurred up to the date of termination.

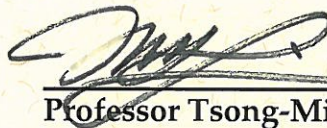

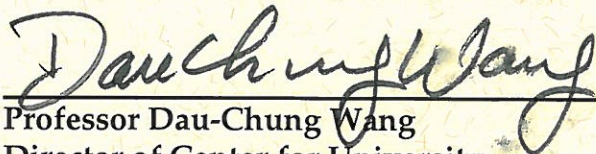
